1	How old are the figures (amount of remaining vegetation) quoted?	The figures quoted in the response to submission are from Government of Western Australia, 2000, <i>Bush Forever</i> , Volume 1, Western Australian Planning Commission,
2	Please note that items on the RNE are mentioned under section 391A and section 528 of the EPBC Act. Section 391A states that the Minister must consider information in the Register of the National Estate in making decisions, and subject to this Act, the Minister must have regard to information in the Register of the National Estate kept under the <i>Australian Heritage Council Act 2003</i> in making any decision under this Act to which the information is relevant. Section 528 protects the 'environment', which is defined in s528 as including 'places in the Register of the National Estate kept under <i>Australian Heritage Council Act 2003</i> ' – the environment is protected from significant impact by actions involving Commonwealth land (s26), Commonwealth marine areas (s23) and by actions of Commonwealth agencies (s28). 116	Is the statement “No species move east-west through the site at present” available elsewhere in the documentation? Please state where.	Existing fence, road and rail infrastructure around the airport site prevents east- west species movement. Security fencing surrounds the airport. Berrigan road and Roe highway prevent animal movement, as does the railway on the North west boundary. However with the proposed rehabilitation of the quarry site ecological linkage of conservation areas will be established over time.

150	Page 36 – This goes off the bottom of the page (formatting error) and can't be read.	The formatting has been corrected.

150	States that "Groundwater quality monitoring will occur for two years following development" is this for individual commercial blocks?	Groundwater quality monitoring is intended to occur for at least two years prior to development in Precinct 5. Monitoring bores are proposed for the perimeter of the precinct and ongoing monitoring is intended as outlined in section 5 of the LWMS.
153	What is Mixed Business? Please state where this can be found in documentation.	Mixed Business is referred to in Section 11 – Non Aviation Development of the Jandakot Airport Master Plan 2009. In this section area 4B is referred to have land uses being office/business type developments. This section goes on further to outline the proposed development for the entire precinct 4, being at the entrance of the Airport, will include Mixed Business type development in line with the permitted and discretionary land uses outlined in the City of Cockburn TPS No. 3.

159	Please provide more detail or include the sections of the Local Water Management Strategy (LWMS) which refer to this.	Please refer to Sections 3.5 of the LWMS for further information on which water will be treated and how. Figure 8 of the LWMS provides a stormwater management conceptual layout.

169	Please state whether and how often you intend to survey in the future.	Orchid surveys will be determined by Kings Park and Botanic Gardens (in conjunction with JAH) as part of their research programme which will be funded on approval of the Master Plan.
185	On what information do you base the statement that "the feeding habitat to be cleared is unlikely to have an impact on cockatoo numbers"?	There are approximately 13,756 ha of suitable vegetation within a 20 km radius of Jandakot Airport. Furthermore 7,317 ha of this habitat is within Bush Forever sites and 4,986 ha is within Parks and Recreation reserves, providing a significant level of security for retention of bushland, so in essence secured for future populations. Furthermore, the rehabilitation of 90ha of habitat for future Black Cockatoo foraging Also to note there is no breeding habitats within the project

		area; with no tree hollows having been observed during the fauna assessment.
189	Have some of these surveys already been done?	This statement should say surveys have been done in accordance with Appendix B of the Additional Information Report.
200	What was the environmental assessment and whose appropriate processes were they?	The environmental assessment was carried out by environmental consultant Keith Lindbeck in 2006, prior to the clearing and he determined that the clearing would not have a significant environmental impact in terms of the EPBC Act and would not require a referral to the Department of Environment and Heritage (at the time). The areas cleared included a small area of banksia and were mainly used as a golf driving range and two locations of speedway tracks.
