

Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) payments to the Airport Building Controller (ABC).

Using Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) can be a quick and easy way of paying the statutory fees required for an application in relation to a Building/Works Permit lodged with the Airport Building Controller (ABC).

However, if the information is not correct or there is information missing, it can be difficult for the Department to match the EFT payment with the corresponding Building Permit/Works permit application submitted to the ABC's throughout the respective States.

Therefore, to assist the ABC and the Department in expediting the processing of the EFT's, the following minimum amount of information should be provided:

- 1. A brief description of the project relating to the specific EFT provided;
- 2. RAPS 15717;
- 3. The specific value of the EFT for that project (not a total of several EFT's); and,
- 4. The ABC's reference number. Note that this can only be obtained from the ABC once the documents submitted have been initially processed and provided with a file.

Please note that this minimum level of information and the Bank Payment EFT Summary Report must be provided to the ABC first. The ABC in turn notifies the Department with the corresponding information relating to a specific Building Permit/Works permit which allows for quicker and more accurate processing by the Department.

Airport Building Controllers (ABCs) are appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) under the Airports (Building Control) Regulations 1996 (the Regulations) to exercise the powers and functions which the Regulations vest in the ABCs, in relation to building control at leased federal airports. ABCs are also appointed as authorised officers by the secretary under the Airports Act 1996 to exercise certain powers under this Act, in relation to leased federal airports.

ABCs are contracted private companies, or employees or officers of such companies, and act independently of the Department. However, ABCs consult with the Department as necessary on certain matters, such as the interpretation of the regulations.
